Attach documentation of a minimum of 12-hours of instructing and 12-hours as a student for a total of 24 hours of instructional development training. For every hour of verifiable instruction of a course for either a college or community college, fire academy, Division of Fire Safety, National Fire Academy, or documented in-service training, you will receive one hour of credit toward re-certification, up to twelve hours. The remaining twelve hours must come from a course or conference you have attended within the last three years for instructional development.
